An Appreciation Séamus O'Connor, Principal Castlecomer Community School

The people of North Kilkenny were hugely saddened on Wednesday morning when news filtered through of the untimely death of Seamus O' Connor, Principal of Castlecomer Community School. Seamus arrived in Castlecomer in 1985 and took up a teaching post in the Presentation Convent. For the next 20 Years Seamus taught Geography and Irish with distinction to the pupils of the Convent and then the Community School. Mr. O' Connor is renowned for his love of his native tongue. School trips to the Gaeltacht's of West Kerry and Connemara have become the stuff of folklore. Another legacy left behind by Seamus were the Ceili Mors he organised every year in the school gymnasium, which were the beginning of many a romance.

Mr. O' Connor's love for Gaeilge was matched only by his passion for sport. He was a huge supporter of all sporting teams in the school and was a renowned mentor on the sidelines of G.A.A. pitches the length and breath of Leinster and beyond. His famous "C'mon Comer" roar is one so many will recall with affection. Nothing gave him more pride than a Castlecomer Community School team bringing home some silverware. That happened quite a bit under his tenure.

Mr. O' Connor's proudest achievement was when he was appointed Principal in 2005. He has served the school and community of North Kilkenny with absolute distinction over the past fifteen years. He is the longest serving Principal of the Community School and has overseen huge development, both educationally and physically, throughout this time

Mr. O' Connor was a true champion of the local communities. He had a deep love for the area of North Kilkenny. He knew its' history, he knew its' values and he knew its' humour. He served as a mentor and friend to staff, parents and students. His dedication to the Community School was immense. In his 36 Years in Castlecomer he touched so many lives. We have lost one of life's great gentlemen.

Our deepest sympathies are extended to his darling wife Shelia, and three children Luke, Ciara & Annie. The town of Castlecomer was blessed when your husband and Dad arrived 36 Years ago. His legacy will endure.
