'National Scandal': €20 million spend on abortion since 2019

Pro-life organisations and politicians have decried the €20 million spent on abortion provision since 2019 as a "national scandal".

The figures were revealed by the HSE in response to a question from leader Peadar Tóibín. They confirmed that €11.5 million was spent in 2019, with a further €9.5 in 2020.

The Pro-life campaign described the figures as a "national scandal" in a statement. Spokesperson Eilis Mulroy added that it is "very apparent from the breakdown that not a cent of the vast allocation of funding was spent on promoting positive alternatives to abortion" The Irish Catholic 18th March 2021.
