A Prayer in Times of Difficulty in our Lives

A Reflection on Gospel Reading in today's Mass

- 1. At the heart of this story we are told that Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and distributed them. In our day this reminds us of the Eucharist, the bread of life, with which Jesus feeds us. Can you recall an experience of Eucharist that was especially significant for you? What was it that made it different? How did it influence your understanding of the Eucharist?
- 2. Take, give thanks, distribute. The actions of Jesus also suggest an attitude to time, gifts and living.

 We take what we are given, give thanks, and use what we have.

 Have you found that having a grateful heart for what you have been given has made it easier for you to share with others?
