Comer Bingo is Back

Bingo will resume in the Community Hall, Castlecomer on Thursday, 28th October with a new starting time of 8.00pm. Following government guidelines, the current restriction on only allowing those fully vaccinated against Covid-19 to attend indoor venues will remain. All patrons must have proof of vaccination Covid 19 pass (vaccine or recovery certificate) and wear a mask for the duration of the bingo. Social distancing will apply.

Report on Maintenance Work on Church Michael O'Boyle, Architect

The current works on the exterior of the church comprise the careful removal of cement mortar pointing on a section of the south facade where there have been persistent problems with dampness within the fabric of the wall. The church has been well-maintained, having undergone a programme of comprehensive conservation-led repair and restoration in 2003-04. The interior was re-painted and other repairs were carried out in 2019. About six months after this re-painting, a recurrence of staining of the paintwork was noted on the west side of the nave. This appears to be due to the build-up of moisture within the wall, which was re-pointed in a cement mortar more than fifty years ago. The build-up of moisture is higher in this location than elsewhere within the external walls, as it is exposed to the prevailing wind and rain from the south-west. Small cracks in the hard cement mortar have allowed driving rain to seep into the walls. This moisture is unable to evaporate through the non-vapour permeable cement. The current work will resolve this issue by replacing the external cement mortar with a traditional vapour permeable lime mortar. The repairs are being carried out by a stone mason with conservation experience under the direction of our conservation architect, Michael O'Boyle. Full scaffolding has been erected to the relevant section of the facade.

The works have been part-funded by a grant of €8,500 from Kilkenny County Council, under the Built Heritage Investment Scheme. The current works are seen as a pilot project and it is intended to apply for further grant aid to replace the cement mortar on other parts of the external façade in future years.
