THE EVIL OF DRUG ADDICTION

Some years ago one of four Jesuits opened a new community in Moss Side in Manchester – famous for being the drug capital of the north of England, it has the poverty, the lawlessness, the prostitution, the homelessness, the street crime and the casual violence that goes along with drug trafficking all over the world. They were given a disused flat in a derelict block of flats. On the wall under the title "My Life" were the saddest few lines he had even read..

'Heat the spoon, Watch it melt, Fill the syringe, and stab yourself'.

He never met the person that wrote those words but often prayed for them. Those are the words of a true addict, someone who feels compelled several times a day to do something to themselves that is desperately harmful and will, in all probability, one day bring about their end. Their entire life has become constricted to a little pool of liquid containing heroin and to those desperate little acts of crime to get the money to buy themselves some more heroin. Let us pray for them and pry for the grace to accompany them and to help them
