Phil Coulter thanks God for gift of his talent

The award-winning Irish composer and musician Phil Coulter said that he thanks God every day for having been able to make a living from his talent. Speaking on Miriam O'Callaghan's *Sunday with Miriam*, Mr Coulter said he is very grateful for the fact that he was born with the "rare gift" of his musical talent.

"There's not a day goes by that I don't thank God for having been able to make a living from my talent", he told Ms. O'Callaghan. He added that he "was also given a work ethic in growing up in the North and it was ingrained in me that if you have a talent, you have a Godgiven responsibility to do something with that talent.

"The talent per se entitles you to nothing. It's what you do with the talent that keeps you with the game".

Mr. Coulter is one of the biggest record sellers on the island of Ireland and is best known for composing *The Town I Loved So Well* and the Eurovision *Congratulations*, which was sung by Cliff Richard.

He has previously spoken about his religious belief, saying that Clonard Monastery is special to him due to his mother's Belfast roots. *The Irish Catholic, Newspaper. Ruadhán Jones.*
