# Joseph, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife.

Isn't it a story of faith?

Joseph, wondering and afraid of what was going on in Mary? Mary, afraid of her call to be the mother of God?

Fear and faith go together. You believe in a person and maybe you'll be let down. You believe in God and you can't pin him down. So much of life is lived in trust: that love once promised will last,

And Mary and Joseph were the same; wanting security in relationship and religion. And their real safety was in God.

# Fourth Sunday in Advent A Reflection on the Gospel in today's Mass

A betrothal in Jewish society in firstcentury Palestine was an expression of the solemn intention and commitment of the betrothed to marry and was taken very seriously by the couple, the extended family and wider society. Betrothal vows and the sanctity of marriage were bedrocks of Jewish life and culture.

Joseph's 'Yes' to God and his embrace and acceptance of God's plan of salvation were as crucial as Marv's acceptance and embrace. All believers for all time will be forever grateful to him. This great saint revealed in that one significant moment that bedrock quality needed to live life in the power of the Holy Spirit: obedience.
