A Reflection for Lent

St Augustine said that people search for God in all sorts of places while they are not aware of God with them and within them. When he became aware of God present in his own heart. he looked back with regret: "You (O God) were there before my eves, but I had deserted even my own self and I did not find the God of mv own heart. You were within me, while I was outside. You were with me but I was not with You." After many years of searching, he found rest at last in the one eternal God who had always been present deep in his heart.

We can also hear Augustine's plea to us: "come back to your heart; in your inner self God has made his home." Spending some quiet time in praver each day during Lent can help us to do this.

We may wonder why it is that we cannot be more in touch with the presence of God in our hearts. This is the way one writer sees it: "We haven't looked at ourselves with the merciful and loving eyes of God"-A God who "is all tenderness and compassion, slow to anger and rich in mercy.
