It is not to impress them but to confirm them in faith. His glory is not partial but total, both interior and exterior, as indicated by the glow of his face and clothes respectively. The Transfiguration directs our focus, beyond the cross to the resurrection.

The Meaning of Lent

The English word 'Lent' comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Lenten, meaning 'Spring'. In other languages the word comes from the Latin, *Quadragesima* – a period of 40 days. In the Christian tradition the forty days is understood to refer to a time of intense prayer and preparation; we remember the biblical stories of Noah and the flood of 40 days, the forty years the Israelites spent wandering in the wilderness and Christ's forty day fast in the desert in preparation for his earthly ministry.

Forms of Friday Penance

The following are suggested as ways of fulfilling Friday penance:

Abstaining from meat or some other food Abstaining from alcoholic drink or smoking Making a special effort at involvement in family prayer

Participate in Mass on Fridays
Visiting the Blessed Sacrament
Making the Stations of the Cross
Fasting from all food for a longer period than
usual and perhaps giving what is saved to the
needy

Helping the poor, sick, old, or lonely.

Pope Francis Message for Lent 2024

Lent is a time of conversion and freedom
In his message for Lent 2024, Pope Francis
invites the faithful to "pause" for prayer and to
assist our brothers and sisters in need, in order to
change our own lives and the lives of our
communities. Most significantly Pope Francis
ends his Lenten message on a hopeful note:
"To the extent that this Lent becomes a time of
conversion, an anxious humanity will notice a
burst of creativity, a flash of new hope." He calls
on us all to "be ready to take risks," inviting us
"to find the courage to see our world, not as in its
death throes, but in a process of giving birth; not
at the end, but at the beginning of a great new
chapter of history."
