Lá Féile Bríde

St. Brigid's Day in ancient times became the reference point for all the seasons that followed. It dictated the ploughing, the sowing, the turning of the sod. The feast was seen as a celebration of the incarnation of Christ into all of life: *"in the milking of cows and the tending of the hearth, In threading the loom and gathering the peat, The breath of prayer blessing each movement, A naming of Creator upon each mindful deed.*

St Brigid of Cill Dara

Saint Brigid of Kildare (The Church of the Oak), also known as the 'Mary of the Gael' was born in the mid-5th century, the daughter of a pagan chieftain and a Christian slave. She founded a monastic community at Kildare, which became one of Ireland's most important Christian centres, unique for its time as it housed both monks and nuns in separate convents under Brigid's leadership. Saint Brigid is associated with numerous miracles, one of the most famous miracles attributed to Saint Brigid is the spreading of her cloak over a large area of land. According to the legend, when Brigid asked the King of Leinster for land to build her monastery, he mockingly suggested she could have as much land as her cloak could cover. Miraculously, her cloak expanded to cover a vast tract of land, enough to establish her monastery.

This year marks the 1500 year since her death. Bishop Nulty celebrated the installation of a relic of Brigid in the church of Kildare last Sunday. The relic was presented by the Brigidine Sisters in Tullow who had received the relic in the 1930s from the Church of St John the Baptist in Lumiar, just outside Lisbon. The relic had been brought to the Church of St John in Lumiar by three Irish Knights in 1273. Bishop Nulty encouraged all who visit the church to pray and to take "a quiet moment in the presence of the relic of a saint and in the presence of Our Lord".

Confirmation Programme

The Confirmation Programme for those receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation began last Wednesday night. 71 boys and girls are presenting for the sacrament. The night, led by Fr Scriven, reflected upon Baptism and Eucharist. They will join us for Mass next Sunday for their Enrolment Ceremony. Another meeting will take place at the end of February.

Congratulations

We extend congratulations to Teresa Hetherington, Angela Byrne and Joseph Fitzpatrick who received the papal award, the *Benemerenti* Medal, at Mass on Friday evening. Mgr Ryan requested these medals through Bishop Coll from Pope Francisto recognise the wonderful and dedicated service which they have given to the parish over many many years. Many thanks for their service and we say *Mile Buiochais* as we gift them the *Benemerenti* Medal.

The Benemerenti Medal was instituted by Pope Gregory XVI in 1832 and is conferred on those who have given long and dedicated service to the Church, their families and the wider community. The medal has the word *Benemerenti* (to a well deserving person) on its face, surrounded by a crowd of oak leaves; the ribbon is made of Papal colours. With the medal is also given a scroll upon which is inscribed: The Supreme Pontiff, Francis, using his power to honour by a mark of distinction has seen fit to bestow upon this gold medal, established for those exceedingly well deserving in Christian matters.
