POPE LEO XIV...TRIBUTE TO HIS PREDECESSORS

At his first mass as Pontiff Pope Leo XIV wore a chasuble of Pope John Paul II—honouring the saint on what would have been his 105th birthday, May 18, 2025, the very day of his installation. The chasuble is the outer garment that the priest wears for the celebration of mass. Using the chasuble of St John Paul II has been widely seen as a powerful tribute to continuity and to his predecessors and another hint from Pope Leo of his future ministry. The chasuble was first used by Pope John Paul II on the Feast of the Epiphany in 1987 while Pope Benedict XVI used it on four major feasts. Pope Francis wore it 31 times highlighting its spiritual and pastoral significance.

Secondly, Pope Leo XIV used a pastoral staff that is steeped in significance. Many recognized it as the staff often used by Pope Saint John Paul II. Called a papal *ferula*, the staff is similar to a bishop's crosier but is topped with a cross or crucifix instead of a shepherd's crook. It is only carried by the pope, the Bishop of Rome – not used by another bishop. The crucifix was first used by Pope Paul VI at the closing of the Second Vatican Council in 1965. This crucifix, which was among several that Pope Paul VI had carried, was then used by Pope John Paul I in 1978. Pope John Paul II used it at his papal inauguration Mass, and then was often seen with this staff throughout his nearly 27-year pontificate, carrying it as he shepherded the Universal Church. Pope Francis also used this crozier shortly after he became pope in 2013, when he took possession of the Lateran Basilica as the Cathedral of the Bishop of Rome.

POPE LEO'S COAT OF ARMS

Pope Leo XIV's devotion to St. Augustine, his life and ministry as a member of the Augustinian order and his focus on the unity of the church are reflected in his episcopal motto and coat of arms. The coat of arms includes the traditional papal symbols of the crossed keys of St. Peter and episcopal mitre, a shield bears a silver fleur-de-lis set against a light blue background and a red heart topped by a flame and pierced by an arrow sit atop a red book framed by an ivory background. Pope Leo XIV's motto—IN ILLO UNO UNUM ("In the One, we are one") sits at the bottom of the crest. The motto echoes St. Augustine's sermon on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one." The blue field evokes the heights of the heavens and is distinguished by its Marian significance; the lily is a classic symbol of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The emblem of the Order of St Augustine, the heart enflamed and pierced by an arrow. Pope Leo XIV told us that "I am a son of St. Augustine, an Augustinian." The pierced heart evokes the words of Saint Augustine's: "You pierced my heart with your love".

The open book symbolizes the Word of God that transforms the human heart, as it did Augustine's. White or ivory in the papal arms is a sign of holiness and purity.
