THE NAME LEO

The last Pope Leo was Pope Leo XIII, who was born in French-occupied Rome in 1810. He served as pope from 1878 until his death in 1903, making his 25-year papacy the fourth longest in the church's history.

The first pope who took the name Leo became pope in 440. Known as "Leo the Great" he promoted the doctrine of papal primacy based on succession from St. Peter and was a peacemaker. Leo III crowned Charlemagne as Holy Roman Emperor in 800. Pope Leo X, pope from 1513-1521, was the last pope to not have been a priest at the time of his election to the papacy. Leo X rejected the Protestant Reformation and condemned Luther in 1521. Of the 13 previous popes named Leo, five are canonized as saints.

In a press briefing after the conclave, Vatican spokesperson Matteo Bruni said the choice of name "is a clear reference to the modern social doctrine of the Church, which began with Rerum Novarum."

Margaret Thompson, an associate professor of history at Syracuse University, remarked that "Leo is a powerful choice," remembering "the father of Catholic social teaching and a champion of the working class". The choice of name puts an emphasis on justice, labour, and the church's role in the modern world."

Bruce Morrill, a distinguished theologian and Roman Catholic studies at Vanderbilt University, called Prevost's name choice "highly significant" and likely a signal of his support for social justice. Pope Leo XIII, who led the church from 1878 to 1903. He had the fourth-longest reign of any pope and produced the encyclical Rerum Novarum.

Breda O'Brien, the Irish commentator, before the conclave, remarked that that the name Leo would be an interesting choice, signalling an embrace of the breadth of Catholic teaching. Leo XIII is revered for his 1891 encyclical, Rerum Novarum, in which Leo advocated for a living wage, the right to adequate rest and to form unions. Recalling the papacy of Leo XIII, she recalls that Leo XIII was an accomplished diplomat, anxious to form links between the world and the Vatican. He re-founded the Vatican Observatory as part of his commitment to science and opened the Vatican archives to scholars. He declared John Henry Newman a cardinal of the church.

Another interesting coincidence is that the cardinals during the conclave lived in Casa Santa Martha which was formerly a hospice founded by Pope Leo XIII in 1891 during a cholera epidemic.
