STATUE OF THE SACRED HEART

Bishop Coll welcomes the Blessed Statue of the Sacred Heart to the Diocese of Ossory. In this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025, the Pilgrim Statue of the Sacred Heart, blessed by Pope Francis, as it continues its pilgrimage throughout Ireland, will visit the Diocese of Ossory in July and August. Bishop Coll extends an invitation to all to join with him in the celebration of a Mass of Welcome, on Sunday, 20th July 2025 at 5.30 p.m. in St Mary's Cathedral. During its visit to Ossory the Statue will rest in the Churches of the Sacred Heart in the parishes of Clogh and Ferrybank.

CLOGH – MUCKALEE – CASTLECOMER PARISHES

In the past number of years planning for the future has been taken place in our Diocese. The Grouping or Clustering of parishes was examined in the time of Bishop Farrell; these clusters have been reviewed in the past twelve months and Castlecomer continues to be 'clustered' with Clogh and Muckalee.

What does 'Cluster' or 'Clustering' mean? Parishes will retain their own identity but will be served by a reduced number of clergy – in some clusters only one priest now serves three or four parishes. It is intended that administration will continue in each parish at the moment. Each Cluster is asked to explore how the parishes can work best together to respond to parish and pastoral needs.

This year, since February, meetings have taken place involving parishioners in all of the clusters, reviewing progress, discussing the present situation and talking about the future: Bishop Coll visited the group here in Castlecomer and subsequently, in Castletown, Bishop Coll met the group at a larger meeting involving all of the parishes of the northern section of our diocese (The Northern Deanery).

On Tuesday night the group from the three parishes met locally to follow on from the discussions in Castletown. Some of the matters discussed this week are:

- The choosing of a name for the combined three parishes.
- The reality that, while at this time there are four priests in our three parishes, this will not continue.
 Already four other clusters have only one priest.
- Discussion about how ministries can be developed in the parishes and how preparation for the sacraments could be done together.

A further meeting will place in September.

SPIRITIAN'S MISSION APPEAL

Annually parishes are invited to support the Priests and Sisters who work on the Missions. This year the Spiritans (formerly The Holy Ghost Missionaries) are visiting the Diocese of Ossory.

The Spiritans were founded in Parish in 1703, dedicated to the Holy Spirit, their members primarily worked in mission territories. Today the Spiritans work in 56 countries throughout the world – the Irish members work in fifteen of them.

Many of the members are now semi-retired but the order continues its involvement in education and have direct responsibility for four parishes in the Archdiocese of Dublin and assist in more than a dozen other parishes.
